Did you ever wonder why ink and toner cartridges are priced the way they are?

The reason ink and toner cartridges are priced as they are is that the manufacturers of ink and toner cartridges have adopted the practice of pricing that cell phone and razor blade sellers use.

King County, Washington: Since 1991, King County has successfully used environmentally friendly toner cartridges in all departments. In 2008, King County purchased 3,400 remanufactured toner cartridges at a cost of approximately \$165,000. These purchases **saved the county an estimated \$250,000 in that year alone,** as the cost of new cartridges is, on average, 2.5 times more than a remanufactured cartridge.

TriNet, San Leandro: TriNet is the country*s largest private provider of human resources outsourcing solutions to small businesses. In the last year, the company has purchased more than 200 remanufactured toner cartridges. TriNet has been purchasing remanufactured toner cartridges for over 5 years with great success. **Cost savings range from 25% - 70% over the price of new cartridges.**

West Contra Costa Unified School District, Richmond, California: The West Contra Costa Unified School District purchases at least 30 remanufactured cartridges each month. They purchase a wide variety of brands and have

not experienced any failures, have no complaints and are saving money by not buying new cartridges.

University of California, Berkeley: For the last several years, one computer lab department has successfully used over 1,000 remanufactured toner cartridges and are pleased with the products.

The Environmental Protection Agency in their" Waste Wise Update "reports:

The difference between Name Brand and Eco Plus Cartridges

What is a name brand cartridge?

Name brand cartridges are manufactured from the same manufactured that manufactured your printer. OEM is an abbreviation commonly used to describe name brand cartridges. OEM is an abbreviation for ORIGINAL EQUIPMENT MANUFACTURERS.

What are Eco Plus Cartridges?

Eco Plus Cartridges are cartridges that undergo a complete remanufacturing process. They are completely disassembled and key parts including the drum, corona wire assembly, wiper blade, and roller are inspected. Worn or defective parts are replaced, and the cartridge is cleaned, refilled and reassembled.

FYI Name Brand Manufacturers price printers using the same method that the manufacturers of razor blades use, which is that they sell you the printer at a low cost, and make their profits by charging high prices for the supplies.

The Environmental Protection Agency in their "Waste Wise Update" states....

Although the term remanufacturing can be quite broad in scope, ranging from minor repairs to complete disassembly of large equipment, a typical scenario is as follows:

Products to be remanufactured are collected and brought to a factory environment where they are completely disassembled. Each component part is cleaned and inspected, then refurbished or replaced as necessary. Parts are inspected for damage and flaws that may require repair or rejection. The parts are then reassembled and resulting products are tested to perform to original specifications. Producing reliable products is the greatest test of a remanufacture's skills. The performance of remanufactured products must be as good as new, in order to compete with originally manufactured products.

"Item No. E. states: For HP printer products, the use of non - HP ink cartridges or a refilled ink cartridge does not affect either the warranty to the customer or any HP support contract with the customer."

However, if your printer is not an HP Printer, we recommend that you contact the manufacturer of your printer to obtain a copy of their limited warranty, if you do not already have a copy.

Additionally, you can refer to the information below about the "Tie-In Sales Provisions" from the Bureau of Consumer Protection

to learn about the Magnuson-Moss Warranty Act of 1975 that prevents manufacturers from 'tying' their warranty to the use of specific products.

"Tie-In Sales" Provisions

Generally, tie-in sales provisions are not allowed. Such a provision would require a purchaser of the warranted product to buy an item or service from a particular company to use with the warranted product in order to be eligible to receive a remedy under the warranty.

What is the difference between Laser and Ink Jet Printers and how to determine the cost of supplies before you buy your new printer.

What is the difference between laser printers and ink jet printers?

Ink jet and laser printers produce copies differently. Laser printers are faster and generally produce better quality documents. Additionally, they can be networked for large offices. Ink jet printers are generally used in homes or small offices and are better for printing photographs.

Is it more expensive to buy a laser printer or an ink jet printer?

Generally speaking, laser printers are more expensive to buy but ink jet printers cost more to operate, as you can print fewer pages per ink jet cartridge than you can from a laser cartridge. However, since you can print more pages with a laser cartridge than with an ink jet cartridge, many people feel that the price they spend on the printer and on the cartridges is worth the extra money.

Determine the cost of your ink and toner.

After you buy your printer you have to buy ink or toner for it, just as you have to buy gasoline for your automobile. Therefore, it is a good idea to determine the cost of your supplies before you buy your printer.

To do this:

- 1. We suggest you ask your sales associate the page yield (the number of pages the printer you are thinking about purchasing) will print per cartrdidge.
- 2. After you know the number of pages a cartridge will print before it runs out of ink, you can divide the cost of the cartridge by the number of pages it will print. This will then provide you with the cost per page (CPP) of printing for the cartridge

Keep in mind that traditional standard page yield was determined by using the 5% coverage rule which is a good average for typical office use. If you are printing graphics the amount of ink you use on each page will go up drastically. Additionally, another thing that determines the page yield is the printer setting you have your printer set on. If you have it set for high resolution printing, more ink will be delivered to the page than if you are using low resolution printing.

ANOTER GOOD THING TO KNOW.. as June of 2004 the ISO established ISO/IEC 19752 that strives for a comprehensive and rigorous definition of measurement with the purpose of creating clear and objective criteria for the comparison of cartridge yields. See ISO/TEC 19752.2004 at www.iso.org
